

DONNELLY HOUSE

A transitional housing program that assists males and females (16 years & over) experiencing homelessness. Donnelly House can support up to 8 individuals at a time. Donnelly House accepts referrals for clients who may be experiencing the following:

- Homelessness and need a residence while setting up an apartment or income supports.
- Waiting to enter a treatment program or returning from a treatment program.
- Needing a place to stabilize from addiction use (must be committed to sobriety).
- Coming from Provincial Corrections and have a plan for permanent housing.
- Being discharged from acute care without permanent housing arrangements.

Residents can stay at Donnelly House for up to three months.

Referrals will be accepted from an Alberta Health Services support only (ie. Social Worker, Addictions Counsellor, Mental Health Therapist, Housing teams, etc.). Clients must also have a community support worker (referral source or other) who is responsible for ensuring they transition into permanent housing within the 3 month period.
